Drop-off & Collection

With our local area currently placed in Tier 4, we ask that parents drop off/collect pupils at their respective drop off zones (map attached). Please maintain social distancing from other parents and make your way back to your vehicle as soon as possible.

Warm Clothes

As part of our Covid protocols, we will be keeping windows and doors open to allow fresh air to circulate within buildings. We will also be encouraging pupils to spend time outside during break times. We would therefore be grateful if all pupils could bring a school coat, hat and gloves to school.

Face Coverings & Sanitiser

Please ensure your son/daughter has a face covering with them at all times (and a spare in their pencil case). This is applicable to pupils in all year groups as pupils in Years 3 to 6 are required to wear masks for certain activities. Pupils must also bring a small bottle of sanitiser which they can keep with them during the day. A reminder from Mr Ashmore that aprons as well as masks are required for DT lessons.

Clubs & Activities

Please note Clubs and Activities for pupils in Years 3 to 6 will begin on Wednesday 6th January and on Monday 18th January for pupils in Years 7&8.

PE & Games Lessons – A message from Mr Winsor

PE and Games lessons will continue as near to normal as possible for the upcoming term. Pupils should come to school in full tracksuits (with PE polo shirts) on the days they have a PE, games or an after school sports club. If they do not have any sport (or are off games), they should come to school in their full school uniform. To maintain hygiene levels, we ask that pupils bring in a change of socks and their games tops to wear during their PE and games lessons. Please note skins are also permitted. Boys will need their hockey equipment (stick, mouth guard, shin pads) and girls will need their netball equipment (skorts, trainers) for games lessons. We are still unsure of the position regarding sports fixtures and will be guided by government and sporting governing bodies. A large number of schools have already made the decision not to play competitive matches this half term. Parents are encouraged to keep checking our school sports website for regular updates.
