Student review of Hamlet at Bristol Old Vic

William Shakespeare's Hamlet: an age-old tragedy. Timeless. A gripping story still relevant to the struggles of the modern man.

The audience are immediately thrust into John Haidar's adaptation of this classic with some grainy and quite frankly distressing footage of a young Prince Hamlet and his mother Gertrude. This is the beginning of a grungy, gothic play in which a paranoid, gun-wielding Hamlet sets out to avenge his late Father.

Alex Eales' set provides slick transitions between changes of scene and setting whilst the story is clearly and intriguingly portrayed by Haidar. The staging adds to this atmosphere and the audience become enveloped within the multifaceted story and titillating cast.

Billy Howles makes the show with his performance as Hamlet. A jealous, betrayed, broken, shell of a man, he lures the audience's eye

around the stage with tremendous interest with his desperate yet skittish psychosis. There are signs of his later hate-fuelled tyranny when he chokes Ophelia and his mind becomes yet further disconnected from his body. Howle beautifully conveys this ill-fated battle between the often conflicted excesses of male emotion and feelings of family loyalty.

The casting largely fits the themes of the play. Nonetheless, the often ill-timed comedic chimes seem out of place and seem to distract from the tension and raw emotion of scenes. Additionally, Isabel Adomakoh Young as Horatio seems disjointed and her manner at times is at odds with an otherwise thought-provoking production.


TSI top merit students

Taunton School adds forgotten heroes to war memorial

Taunton School added four names to its war memorial this month as pupils, staff and former students came together for four days of Remembrance events. The four veterans had been missing from the monument in the school grounds and were added as the school commemorated Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday.

The names added to the war memorial were:

- Gaston Vincent (French Resistance radio operator who saved 30 Jewish children), who attended Taunton School in 1909 served in both World Wars and died in 1944
- Sergeant-Gunner Gerald Gainsford (RAF), who joined Taunton School in 1929 and died in June 1940 when his aircraft was shot down over the North Sea
- Corporal Thomas Arlidge (Australian Army), who joined Taunton Prep School in 1926 and died fighting in Crete in May 1941
- Corporal Richard John (Prince Alfred's Guard, South African Army), who joined Taunton School in 1929 and died in Italy in June 1944

The recent additions mean there are now 320 names on the Taunton School war memorial – 168 from World War I and 158 from World War II.




Core PE swimming programme

Students studying our core PE swimming programme have been learning water polo, synchronised swimming, lifesaving skills and stroke technique work so far this academic year.













ESSA Finals




The team finished 3rd overall and have qualified for National Finals in Leeds in December.
