#### **Autumn Concert**

The Autumn Concert on 23rd November was a chance for a wide range of music ensembles to present performances in front of a highly appreciative audience in the chapel. Instrumental ensembles took centre stage in the first half of the programme, with the Orchestra opening with the effervescent Overture to Die Fledermaus, before launching into the uplifting theme from E.T. The Wind Band entertained with an arrangement of Strike Up the Band and an old-school Disney medley, featuring a number of well-loved theme songs. Smaller chamber ensembles demonstrated impressive student leadership - these included the Horn Ensemble, two String Quartets, and the Brass Ensemble, who enveloped the audience in sound, performing antiphonally from four corners of the chapel.

After the interval, the focus turned to choirs and bands. Chapel Choir performed Macmillan's powerful O Radiant Dawn and a luxurious setting of Sure On This Shining Night, while AVE contrasted the highly atmospheric Glow by Eric Whitacre with the celebrated Boogie Woogie Bugle Boy - a great showcase for the whole choir, and featuring the expert trumpet-playing of Mr Paul. The Dance Band performance featured Ronia C as a saxophone soloist in No Time to Die, while Rock Band brought great intensity to their performance, led by singers Amelia dJ, Sofia M and Felicity H. Percussion Ensemble gave a cleverly choreographed interpretation of Breakdown, and the event drew to a close with toe-tapping versions of Shine and Happy performed with irresistible energy by the Funk Band, fronted in style by Annabelle M, Katrina M, Lily B and Rosie S.

The evening was a great showcase for the full range of musical interests and styles that TS students engage with every week, and at the first major ensemble concert of the year, it was clear that there is huge potential in these groups for future performances in the remainder of this year, and beyond.


